



GUIDELINES EMERGING PRODUCER PLACEMENT (EPP)

Screen NSW is looking for the next wave of emerging producers.

The EPP will provide emerging producers with a unique opportunity to gain experience with NSW screen production companies, in addition to working with Screen NSW Sector Investment team. EPP is a fast-track career opportunity by matching highly experienced screen industry practitioners with undiscovered emerging producing talent.

Three EPP placements will be offered in the 2022/23 round.

BEFORE YOU START

The Emerging Producers Placement Program is competitive and putting together a strong application takes time and energy.

Before beginning your application, please read these guidelines for information on:

- application closing date
- eligibility requirements
- support material requirements
- assessment criteria

WHO CAN APPLY?

- One placement will be reserved for an emerging First Nations (Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander) Producer.
- Two placements will be reserved for an emerging producer who identifies from under-represented groups including people from Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CaLD) backgrounds, people with disability, LGBTQI+ people, people from western Sydney and people from regional NSW.
- Emerging producers who currently reside in NSW.
- Have at least one credit as producer on a short film or web series.

You can discuss with Screen NSW prior to making an application.

WHEN CAN I APPLY?

Applications to the Emerging Producers Placement Program open on **Monday 19 September 2022 at 9:00am** and close on **Monday 17 October....**





HOW DO I APPLY?

You will need to complete an online expression of interest detailing how you meet the Selection Criteria and why you believe the attachment would be of value to you at this point in your career.

You will need to address the following criteria:

- A demonstrated understanding of production budgets.
- Highly developed organisational skills and ability to meet deadlines.
- Analytical and research skills, and the ability to collate information and write reports using a variety of software packages.
- An ability to work independently and to exercise initiative, sensitivity and discretion.
- A knowledge of current development and project financing practices within Australia.

HOW WILL MY APPLICATION BE ASSESSED?

Your application will be assessed on the basis of your experience and your expression of interest relating to the selection criteria.

Short-listed applicants will be invited to interview.

WHO WILL ASSESS MY APPLICATION?

Applications will be assessed by a panel of Screen NSW staff including Sector Investment Managers. Short-listed applicants will be invited to interview, and subsequent recommendations will be considered by the Head of Screen NSW.

WHEN WILL THE PLACEMENT START?

The first placement will begin **early November 2022**, with the dates to be mutually agreed by both parties

WHAT HAPPENS IF MY APPLICATION IS SUCCESSFUL?

You will be notified of your successful application by email in October, along with an interview invitation.

WHAT HAPPENS IF MY APPLICATION IS UNSUCCESSFUL?

You will be notified of your unsuccessful application in October via email. We are happy to provide feedback on the assessment of your application.
